1. Recycle your paint, paper and electronics at **Harry's Farmers Market, Upper Hembree Road, Alpharetta, GA**. Diverting these materials from landfills helps not only to protect our environment, but creates jobs, creates public awareness, and allows Reaping Nature to provide environmental education programs to schools. 2. **Kayak Clean-up Event at Fort Pulaski in Savannah, GA** – On April 21, 2012 in honor of Earth Day, a kayak clean-up of the marshes and waterways of Fort Pulaski National Monument is scheduled. This event is in collaboration with Clean Coast, a Savannah-based 501(c)3 non-profit volunteer organization that works to combat marine debris by holding beach and marsh clean-ups on the Georgia Coast. 3. **Earth Day on the National Mall, Washington, District Of Columbia** - The centerpiece of Earth Day in the United States will be a rally on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. Tens of thousands of environmentally-conscious people from all walks of life and all parts of the country will be joined by civic leaders and celebrities for this special event to galvanize the environmental movement. illegal waste. The mission of this campaign is to map and clean up the illegal waste that is littering our countryside and then to delve deeper into the reasons as to why we, as global citizens, are wasting so much. In 2012, starting from the 24th of March until the 25th of September, a series of cleanups will sweep over the globe, touching all continents, bringing together millions of volunteers in 100 countries.
